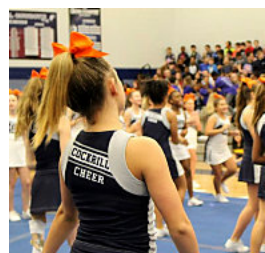
Cowboy Pride

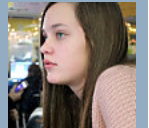

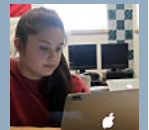
Nikki Morgan (8th) would want to speak over the topic of kindness in our school and how great our school's CREED is.
