I think that Steve invented the computer because he wanted people to have better computers. And he could make money off of something that he loved to do.

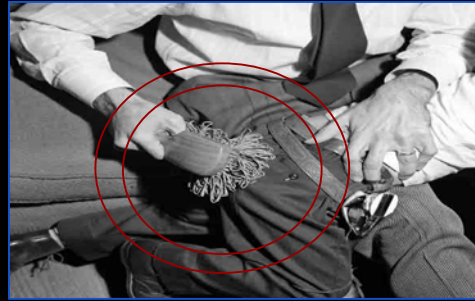
It was invented year 1950 and it is one of the pain free spank sticks.
